Responsive Design: What's the Big Deal?

Some statistics (...as of 2016):


Search engines are the starting point for mobile research, with an estimated 48% of mobile internet users starting their search on search engines


Consequently, the #1 search engine, Google started to significantly use mobile compatibility as a factor when ranking websites. 4 out of 5 consumers use a Smartphone to shop

70% of mobile searches result in an online action within an hour of the search being conducted

50% of mobile users will abandon of web page if it takes more than 10 seconds to load, and 60% won't return to the site







Responsive Design

Other things to note:

Do not use large fixed width elements

Content should not rely on a particular viewport width to render well

Use CSS media queries to apply different styling for small and large screens

Bootstrap takes care of these issues for you

What is Bootstrap?

Bootstrap is a free front-end framework for faster and easier web development

Bootstrap includes HTML and CSS based design templates for typography, forms, buttons, tables, navigation, modals, image carousels and many others, as well as optional JavaScript plugins

Bootstrap also gives you the ability to easily create responsive designs

Bootstrap was developed by Mark Otto and Jacob Thornton at Twitter, and released as an open source product in August 2011 on GitHub

In June 2014 Bootstrap was the No.1 project on GitHub

Bootstrap was created at Twitter in mid-2010

Prior to being an open-sourced framework, Bootstrap was known as *Twitter Blueprint*

Bootstrap History

A few months into development, Twitter held its first Hack Week and the project exploded as developers of all skill levels jumped in without any external guidance

It served as the style guide for internal tools development at the company for over a year before its public release, and continues to do so today





Why Use Bootstrap?

jQuery

Bootstrap uses jQuery for JavaScript plugins (like modals, tooltips, etc) However, if you just use the CSS part of Bootstrap, you don't need jQuery

Bootstrap Grids - Grid Classes

The Bootstrap grid system has five classes:

.col- (extra small devices - screen width less than 576px)

.col-sm- (small devices - screen width equal to or greater than 576px)

.col-md- (medium devices - screen width equal to or greater than 768px)

.col-lg- (large devices - screen width equal to or greater than 992px)


.col-xl- (xlarge devices - screen width equal to or greater than 1200px)


The classes above can be combined to create more dynamic and flexible layouts (more later)



h3 Bootstrap heading (24px)


